Biographical notes

Michel C. Doré is Associate Professor at *Université du Québec à Montréal* in the Major Risk Management graduate diploma program. He is a registered paramedic and a registered nurse. Dr. Doré cumulates 31 years of experience in emergency management. During his career, he participated in the management of numerous major disasters including the PCB fire in St-Basile-le-Grand in 1988, the 1998 Ice storm, the 2009 Influenza pandemic response, the 2007 Libanon, the 2010 Haiti repatriations and 2017 Québec's floods.

He has been Assistant Deputy Minister for Regions and Programs Branch of Health Canada and Associate Deputy Minister for *la Direction générale de la sécurité civile et incendie* of *Sécurité publique Québec*.

In 2007, the Canadian Center for Emergency Preparedness awarded him the Canadian Emergency Management Award. In 2012, he received the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for his contributions to Emergency response in Canada. Last February, the Quebec government awarded him the Emergency Management Lifetime Award.

Dr. Doré holds a doctoral degree in Sociology from the University of North Texas and a master's degree in Public Health from *Université de Montréal*. Since 1993, Dr. Doré holds the professional designations of Certified Emergency Manager from the International Association of Emergency Managers and of *Certifié en Gestion des Urgences* of the *Association de sécurité civile du Québec*.
